About the Conference

The Fifth edition of the OECD Conference of Mining Regions and Cities will provide a forum for authentic exchanges between all parties within the mining sector and Indigenous communities, aimed at cultivating pathways for positive development. Since its inception in 2016, this conference has brought together diverse stakeholders to deliberate on policies and strategies aimed at enhancing well-being and fostering development in regions specializing in mining and mineral processing.

This year's conference expects to gather around 300 participants, including at least 50 distinguished representatives from global governments, communities and universities, underscoring a commitment to collaboration on a global scale. Central to the conference's mission is the convergence of policy makers, both public and private sectors, and Indigenous leaders to explore the transformative shifts underway in the global mining economy, particularly with the increasing focus on critical minerals.

Sessions will be organized around two thematic pillars: Partnering for meaningful development in mining regions, and Future-proofing regional mineral supply for the energy transition into crucial themes. It will cover discussion around Indigenous-led pathways to sustainable futures in mining, aligning Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) initiatives with the need of mining regions or advancing circular practices to increase local value-added.

This year's conference has a special focus on improving interactions between Indigenous peoples and the mining industry. A pre-conference discussion is being co-organized with Indigenous leaders from Northern Ontario, whose outcome will include a call for action that will be presented in the main session of the conference.

This conference is an integral element of the OECD Mining Regions and Cities Initiative that is part of the OECD's Centre for Entrepreneurship, SMEs, Regions and Cities. This Initiative serves as a platform for exchanging good practices and promoting international standards aimed at improving well-being outcomes in mining regions.

People attending the conference include also members from two OECD networks: mining regions and cities and the involving Indigenous Communities in Regional Development.
